CRS 01	<b>AIDS Care Orientation Workshop (ACOW)</b>	A sensitization workshop for orienting participants to support people with HIV/AIDS related concerns, at both personal and institutional level. It focuses on facts about HIV/AIDS, individual vulnerability and responsibilities, positive attitudes and basic helping skills among others. It is ideal for senior and middle management staff of both governmental and non-governmental institutions	1 week	Ush 260,000	US \$ 600*
CRS 02	<b>Introduction to HIV/AIDS Counseling (Basic)</b>	A Course designed to build a cadre of healthcare providers to prepare clients for HIV/AIDS tests and to receive test results. It addresses basic facts about HIV/AIDS, basic helping skills, pre and post testing counseling skills. It is suitable for individuals working in healthcare, HIV testing institutions and counseling aides.	2 weeks	Ush 400,000	US \$ 1200
CRS 03	<b>HIV/AIDS Counseling course</b>	This course prepares one to become a counselor capable of meeting the information needs of clients, preparing them for pre and post HIV test realities, and providing the necessary psychological support for positive life style. Focus is on, counseling theories, counseling models and techniques, ethical issues in HIV/AIDS care, code of conduct for counseling practice, behavior change, etc. It is suitable for individuals and groups working in service organizations and other institutions	3 modules of 2, 2 and 1 week over a period of 6 months. CRS 04	<b>HIV/AIDS Counseling course</b>	An intensive course tailored to suit the needs of international participants. It is designed to train and orient participants, with the required knowledge and skills to satisfy information and psychological needs of clients and to offer support for positive life style. CRS 05	<b>HIV/AIDS Counselor Supervisor's course</b>	A course aimed at building the capacity of program/project managers to supervise HIV/AIDS counselors. It addresses counseling standards, practice, support and supervision, as well as monitoring and evaluating counseling work. <b>CRS 09</b>	<b>HIV/AIDS Community Care Course (TOT)</b>	This course is designed to impart facts about care and prevention of STDs/HIV/AIDS, enhance skills of community based workers in the mobilisation of communities to respond to HIV/AIDS and initiate, manage and support community based AIDS programs. Focus is on skills for training of trainers, use of participatory approaches, planning and implementation, as well as monitoring and evaluation of training programs. It is most suitable for local participants at the level of project coordinators, trainers, counselors and frontline (midlevel) managers of community based organizations.	3 modules of 2, 2 and 1 week over a period of 6 months. <b>CRS 10</b>	<b>Clinical Management of HIV/AIDS Course</b>	This is a highly practical course, offering a strong hands-on experiential learning at our clinical training facility that uses the outpatients AIDS clinic and committed clients as aides to learning. The course covers, comprehensive care of PLWHA, clinical management of opportunistic infections, use of antiretroviral therapy in HIV/AIDS care. <b>CRS 13</b>	<b>Child Counseling Course</b>	This intensive course, offered in collaboration with <a href="#">RATN</a> , aims at building capacity in the field of communicating with children. <b>CRS 18</b>	<b>Gender and HIV/AIDS (to start in 2007)</b>	This course is aimed at strengthening Gender responsive HIV/AIDS management and service delivery especially at grass root level. <b>CRS 19</b>	<b>ART Clinical and Programmatic Management</b>	This course is for middle level managers and is offered in collaboration with <a href="#">RATN</a> . It aims at enhancing development and implementation of ART programmes. It orients participants in a wide range of issues in clinical and programmatic management of ART in resource-limited settings. Course content covers among others, HIV/AIDS epidemiology, patho physiology of HIV, comprehensive care and support, eligibility criteria and policies, models of ART service delivery, community participation, monitoring and evaluation.	3 Weeks(15 days)	Ush 1,800,000	US \$ 2300

<b>CRS 22</b>	<b>Comprehensive HIV/AIDS Care Fields officers' Course</b>	A highly intensive course aimed at equipping participants with knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for the provision of quality home based HIV/AIDS care, including antiretroviral therapy. <b>CRS 23</b>	<b>HIV/AIDS care skills for Laboratory Personnel</b>	The aim of this course is to equip laboratory technicians with relevant knowledge and skills for improved HIV/AIDS care and support services. <b>CRS 24</b>	<b>TB Management and Septrin Prophylaxis Course</b>	This course aims at imparting participants with both theoretical and practical knowledge/skills on TB case detection, diagnosis, treatment and prevention. Topics covered include, establishment of a TB-DOTS strategy, specimen collection, laboratory diagnosis, community education and mobilization., comprehensive and synoptic analysis of the utilization of Septrin Prophylaxis among PLWHA to prevent severe OI.
